June 29, 1812.

The Governor commissioned Samuel Paynter Esquire to be Lieutenant Colonel commandant of the eighth Regiment.

June 30, 1812.

Richard Corker to be Ensign of the 5th Company on the 5th Regiment.

"At Wilmington (Del.) immediately on receipt of the declaration of war, the old officers of the late CONTINENTAL ARMY residing in that borough and its vicinity, assembled, with others, and associated for the particular defence of the place, 'from invasion when the young and active may be called into distance service.' The subscription paper for this purpose is headed by Colonel McClane, Major Jaquet, Captain Roche and Captain Kirkpatrick, of the old continental line, and Drs. Titton, Munroe, and Smith of the old staff—a venerable and honorable commencement."—Niles Register.

"Captain Goodwin's company of light infantry in Sussex Co. Delaware, of 45 men in uniform, have unanimously volunteered their services to the Governor as part of the state's quota of 100,000 militia. This is the first instance of the kind that has occurred in that state."—Niles Register.
